Day-by-Day Itinerary

January 12 – DEPART USA

We meet at our international departure airport to begin our journey to the Holy Land. After check-in and security procedures, we board our overnight flight to Israel.

January 13 – ARRIVE TEL AVIV

Arrive in Tel Aviv – Ben Gurion Airport. Meeting and assistance at airport, board your modern deluxe bus and leave the airport to Jaffa. Time permitting, after a tour in Jaffa, transfer to your hotel on the shores of the Mediterranean Sea for dinner and overnight (D)

January 14 – CAESAREA – MEGIDDO – NAZARETH – MOUNT ARBEL – TIBERIAS

After breakfast we travel to Caesarea by the Sea, an ancient port city built by Herod the Great. Here we will have a brief visit to the magnificent city with Roman, Byzantine, and Crusader ruins. We will elaborate on the story of the baptism of Cornelius, the first gentile converts into Christianity, and on the journeys of Paul – those events that led Caesarea Maritima to become the springboard of Christianity to the West. We depart to Megiddo – a strategic city overlooking the gathering place for the world's end-time armies (Armageddon).



Travel to Mount Precipice, reflecting on Jesus' rejection in Nazareth. Continue to the Sea of Galilee, stopping at Mount Arbel to enjoy the view of the surrounding area, before checking into our hotel in Tiberias on the Sea of Galilee for dinner and overnight. (B/D)

January 15 – SEA OF GALILEE – CAESAREA PHILIPPI – MOUNT OF BEATITUDES – CAPERNAUM – BAPTISM

After breakfast we sail on the Sea of Galilee aboard a replica of a fishing boat from Jesus' time. We will dock at Ginnosar to visit the ancient boat museum (featuring a 2000-year-old fishing boat). Our journey proceeds to Caesarea Philippi, where Peter confessed that Jesus is

the Messiah the Son of God. We visit the high place to include the grotto marking the gates of Hades. We will then proceed to the Mt. of Beatitudes the hillside where Jesus delivered the sermon on the mount.



We will then visit Capernaum, Jesus Galilean ministry base. Our final stop for the day will be at the Jordan River, here you will have the opportunity to be baptized in the same waters where John the Baptist baptized Jesus before returning to our hotel. (B/D)

January 16 – MAGDALA – BEIT SHEAN – JERICHO – DEAD SEA

After breakfast we visit Magdala, the hometown of Mary Magdalene, featuring a 1st-century synagogue, the oldest discovered on the shores of Galilee. It contains a remarkable stone carving of the Temple, including a menorah depiction. We travel south through the Jordan valley. We will visit Beth She'an, or Scythopolis as it was called by the Romans. 1 Samuel 31 tells us that King Saul was defeated by the Philistines and died on nearby Mount Gilboa. When the Philistines found Saul's body, they fastened it to the wall of Beth She'an. Later, during Jesus' time, Scythopolis was a member of the Decapolis, a group of ten cities sharing Greek culture and government. Driving to the south, we come to Jericho – the 1st city to be captured by Joshua as part of his conquest of the Land. See the famous Sycamore tree. Check-in to our hotel at the Dead Sea with time to relax, enjoy the spa facilities, and experience the unique sensation of floating in the Dead Sea. (B/D)

January 17 – MASADA – EIN GEDI – QUMRAN – JERUSALEM

After breakfast we travel to the mountain fortress of Masada, the fortress built by King Herod the Great and made famous by the Zealots in 73/74 AD with the standoff against the Romans.

We visit the fortress and see the ruins that are considered

a World Heritage Site by the UNESCO. We then continue to Ein Gedi Lookout, the oasis in the desert where the meeting between David and King Saul took places and where many of the psalms were written by David. Then visit Qumran the location where the Dead Sea Scrolls were found by a Bedouin boy back in 1947. There we will see the caves and other buildings that the Essenes, the group of Jews who wrote the scrolls lived. Arriving in Jerusalem, stop on Mount Scopus. Enjoy Genesis Welcome to the Holy City (B/D)



January 18 – TEMPLE MOUNT – POOL OF BETHESDA – MOUNT OF OLIVES – BETHLEHEM – SHEPHERD’S FIELD – JERUSALEM (WESTERN WALL TUNNELS)

This morning, conditions permitting, we will begin our tour with a visit to the Temple Mount, where the Jewish Temple once stood. Our exploration leads us to the Pool of Bethesda and St. Anne's Church, where Jesus performed healing miracles, inspiring reflection on the power of faith. Next, we visit Mount of Olives where we take in a breathtaking panoramic view of Jerusalem. From here we walk the Palm Sunday Road following the path Jesus took as he entered Jerusalem triumphantly. We stop at Dominus Flevit, the site where Jesus wept over Jerusalem. We travel to Bethlehem, where we visit the Nativity church, built over the cave where Jesus was born. We continue to Shepherd's field, where angels appeared to the shepherds, announcing the birth of Christ. These fields are also associated with the Book of Ruth, where Ruth gleaned in Boaz's fields, becoming an ancestor of Jesus. Return to our hotel. After Dinner our guide will take us deep beneath Jerusalem's old city as we enter the Western Wall Tunnels. Walk along the massive stones that once formed the western retaining wall of the Second Temple. (B/D)

January 19 – YAD VASHEM – ISRAEL MUSEUM – MOUNT ZION – JEWISH QUARTER – WAILING WALL – CITY OF DAVID – (THE NIGHT SPECTACULAR AT THE TOWER OD DAVID MUSUEM)

This morning, we visit Yad Vashem, Israel's official Holocaust Memorial & Museum, dedicated to the six million Jewish lives lost during the Holocaust. We will continue to the Israel museum where we will visit the Second Temple Period Model of Jerusalem, a 1:50 scaled model of the city from the 1st century AD, followed by a visit the Shrine of the Book where the Dead Sea Scrolls are on exhibit. Next, we drive to Mt. Zion to visit the Upper Room, the place of the Last Supper. We continue to the Jewish Quarter. Free time for lunch. On to the Western Wall, experience Judaism's holiest site. Next visit the City of David including the Pilgrimage Road and the Pool of Siloam. Return to our hotel. After dinner (subject to confirmation) enjoy the classic Night Spectacular at the Tower of David Citadel. (B/D)



January 20 – GETHSEMANE – HOUSE OF CAIAPHAS – VIA DOLOROSA – HOLY SEPULCHER – GARDEN TOMB

Today is our last day in the holy land, and we want to make the most of every moment. We start our tour with a visit to the Garden of Gethsemane, where the passion of Jesus began followed by a visit to the home of the High Priest, Caiaphas. We enter the Old City we follow the Via Dolorosa, the traditional route of Jesus Passion, as we walk toward the church of the Holy Sepulcher. Finally, we make our way to the Garden Tomb, a peaceful spot where we can remember Christ's crucifixion, burial, and resurrection and share in the Lord's supper. Where Jesus was buried and later resurrected. Return to our hotel (B/D)

January 21 – ARRIVE USA

Today our memorable journey and Holy Land pilgrimage comes to an end. We will transfer to the airport in Tel Aviv and board the plane for our return flight home.

Terms and Conditions

Included in Tour Price: Round-trip airfare and transfers (per brochure); lodging in first-class hotels; breakfast and dinner daily; gratuities and tips; entrance fees; air-conditioned motor coach; experienced English-speaking guide.

Not Included in Tour Price: Passport costs; visas and vaccinations (if required); lunches not on the tour menu; food and beverages not included in tour meals; excursions not listed; trip, travel, accident, and baggage insurance; items of a purely personal nature such as laundry, telephone, Internet, room service orders, etc.; and all other items not explicitly mentioned.

Passports and VISAs: Each tour member is required to present a valid passport with an expiration date of **June 23, 2026** or later. A valid copy of the passport will need to be submitted to our office no later than 120 days before departure (September 15, 2025). Visa requirements vary by country and it is each passenger's responsibility to obtain necessary visas prior to travel.

Tour Itinerary: Woodrow Kroll Ministries (WKM) strives to adhere to the printed itinerary, however, circumstances may necessitate changes without advance notice during the tour. WKM reserves the right to change the itinerary and is not responsible for any changes caused by unforeseen circumstances beyond its control. Passengers will be responsible for lodging and meal expenses if changes require additional overnights not included in the tour.

Group Size: The size of the group will be a maximum of 50 people, determined by the order of registrations received (earliest registration date).

Limitations on Travel: By registering, each tour member affirms that he or she is in good health and able to walk and travel on the tour. Many tour sites are not accessible to individuals with physical challenges and may limit the overall tour experience. WKM does not provide additional assistance to passengers with physical or mobility limitations, as tour itineraries require full mobility. Be aware that our tours are operated outside the U.S. where the Americans with Disabilities Act is not applicable and facilities for disabled individuals are limited. The touring motor coaches, are generally not equipped with wheelchair ramps or lifts.

All children under 18 must be accompanied by an adult. Accompanying adults are responsible for children and their safety, including providing necessary safety equipment. If you are traveling with children, you are solely responsible for their behavior and for monitoring them throughout the tour. If a person under the age of 18 years will be traveling with an adult other than his/her parents, or with only one parent, a notarized letter by the parents, or non-traveling parent, granting authorization to travel, including the dates of travel and locations of travel, should be carried.

Accommodations: Tour price is based on double occupancy (two people sharing a room). Single rooms may be smaller than double rooms and, when available, will incur an additional charge of \$1,000 for the tour itinerary. Roommates are assigned if available; otherwise, single-room occupancy may apply.

Airline Tickets and Seating: The tour price includes IATA jet economy class transportation from the international departure city, applicable on all IATA and ARC carriers. WKM reserves the right to choose the air carrier, routing, and departure time for each passenger. Airfares used are based on contracted group fares and are highly restrictive. Seats will be assigned by the airline at check-in. Payments for and restrictions on airline tickets are governed by the applicable fare.

Cancellation fees levied by the airlines are applicable if you cancel or

change your air ticket for any reason after the purchase of the air ticket.

Due to group rates, WKM does not participate or allow passengers to use points, miles, or other airline-related offerings on group contracted airfare. The tour is available for a Land Only price of \$2,998 per person, excluding all international flights for passengers looking to arrange their own airfare. Passengers planning to arrange their own air transportation should notify WKM in writing with their tour registration and will be responsible for their own airfare, any airport transfers, and any additional overnights incurred by booking their own flights.

Baggage: Each tour member is allowed one (1) piece of checked luggage whose overall dimensions do not exceed 62 inches (length + width + height) and whose weight does not exceed fifty (50) pounds in total; and one (1) personal item. Tips to hotel porters are included for one normal-sized piece of luggage.

Payments and Fees: An initial deposit of \$400 per person is required to make a reservation. An additional payment of \$1,600 per person is due September 26, 2025 (105 days before departure). The final payment is due no later than November 10, 2025 (60 days before departure). Failure to make the final payment by November 10, 2025, will result in cancellation and forfeiture of the \$400 deposit and any amounts already paid for airfare. Payments can be made by credit card, but are preferred by personal check or money order. Reservations received after September 26, 2025, may incur additional charges due to supplier contract terms.

Cancellations and Refunds: If a passenger cancels his/her tour registration, there will be a cancellation fee of \$200 per person up until 105 days before departure (September 26, 2025). Cancellations made between 105 days and 60 days before departure (November 10, 2025) will have a cancellation fee of \$400 and any amounts already paid for airfare. There is no refund for cancellations made within 59 days of departure, no-shows, or partially completed tours. All cancellation requests must be made in writing to Woodrow Kroll Ministries.

WKM reserves the right to cancel the tour at any time. In the event of a cancellation, deemed necessary by WKM, it is the sole responsibility of WKM to refund all monies recovered (funds recovered less non-refundable fees, expenses, or penalties).
